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



Age groups: population and percent share by sex 2021 Population - Housing Census



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

Percentage distribution of Resident Population by sex and legal marital status 2021 Population - Housing Census







Percentage distribution of households by size





Infant mortality rate: the number of children dying at less than 1 year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.










Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP




Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP



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



Euro area countries: General Government deficit/surplus as a percentage of GDP, 2022


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











Dispatches - Exports, including oil products (in bil. €)












Dispatches - Exports (in bil. €)





Population aged 15 years and over by employment status





Persons employed aged 15 years and over by main sector of the economy










Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2022


Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2022


Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2022









Pupils per teacher (primary schools)



Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)





Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)




Students: technical sector - universities








