




Age groups: population and percent share by sex 2021 Population - Housing Census



Percentage distribution of Resident Population by sex and legal marital status 2021 Population - Housing Census





Distribution (%) of Resident Population by region







Percentage distribution of Resident Population by groups of citizenship



Percentage distribution of households by size









Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP






Revenue of General Government as percentage of GDP





Euro area countries: HICP. Annual average rate of change (%), 2023

















Dispatches - Exports, including oil products (in bil. €)












Dispatches - Exports (in bil. €)



1a. Population aged 15 years and over by employment status, quarterly data, 2023 and 2024 (Q2)



Population aged 15 years and over by employment status



Persons employed aged 15 years and over by main sector of the economy








Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2023


Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2023


Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2023








Pupils per kindergartner (kindergartens)

Pupils per teacher (primary schools)





Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)




Students: technical sector - universities







Percentage distribution of nights spent by residents and non residents in hotels except campsites, 2023








